A “Learning Community” Approach

Strathmore Primary School implements a “*Learning Community*” approach to deliver high quality teaching and learning experiences and social-emotional development for children. The physical design of many of the school's learning spaces supports the approach, as does the way in which teachers work together in Professional Learning Teams to know and understand the needs of all learners in their level. Students build independent learning behaviours and develop a strong understanding of themselves as learner, preparing them for the skills they will need in the future such as collaboration, communication, critical thinking, problem solving, character, citizenship and creativity.

School-Wide Positive Behaviour

A School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework focuses on promoting expectations about the positive behaviours that contribute to the creation of a safe, inclusive, and productive environment centred on **Safety, Respect and Learning**.

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A Vibrant and Engaging Curriculum

Strathmore Primary School delivers the Victorian Curriculum. Teachers use a combination of explicit, targeted teaching and inquiry-learning approaches to provide support and challenge to meet the needs of all learners. Throughout all areas of the curriculum **digital technologies** are a strong feature. Students not only build knowledge and skills, but also develop habits and mindsets that enable them to become confident and resilient learners who are able to explore their curiosity in education. Each day, students engage in dedicated learning sessions for:

- **Literacy** (including reading, viewing, writing, speaking and listening)
- **Numeracy**
- **Inquiry Learning** (including science, technology, geography, history and economics)



Weekly sessions are held for specialist subjects including **Visual Arts, Italian Language, Music, Physical Education and Literature and Library**.

Students participate in off-site excursions and direct-experiences on-site at school that enhance their engagement and curiosity in learning. Students in the upper years participate in events such as sporting, swimming and athletic carnivals and camps are a feature from Year 3 onwards, providing exciting adventure experiences for students to build their skills and confidence in a variety of outdoor pursuits and settings.
