Pyjama Day was fantastic!


It occurred on the 8th of May and nearly every student got into their comfiest, coolest pj's you can imagine!

Thank you to all who donated! Bye for now.





PLASTIC OCEANS

A select group of Grade 6 students had the opportunity to participate in a two-day excursion at Ecolinc Bacchus Marsh to learn more about environmental issues which affect our waterways and marine life. The excursion/course was called 'A Plastic Ocean'. They learnt about – What plastics are, and how plastic is made? They then conducted experiments on plastic and were able to define what microplastics are? Finally, they used all the information they gathered from the day to learn further about casein plastic. Students created their own miniature sculptures from a biodegradable plastic which they made by combining hot milk and vinegar.

During day 2 of the Plastic Oceans excursion was spent at ACMI in Federation Square. Students gained skills in animation, filmmaking and creating effective messaging. Students used stop animation to produce educational messages about plastics in the environment and its effects on animals and humans.

We had a Webex with a Marine Biologist who taught us about microplastics and their impact on animals. I found that interesting!






