Our Marvellous Maths mornings throughout the year provide parents and carers with an opportunity to see and be involved in the Mathematics learning within the classroom. Students share their understandings in a variety of tasks including games, problem solving and mathematical investigations.

At Strathmore Primary School Mathematics is an important part of all our students learning. Mathematics helps students develop important skills in numbers, measurement, shapes, and data.

It also introduces them to key ideas like patterns, logic, and problem-solving, which are essential for understanding the world around them. Our Maths program builds a strong foundation so children can confidently use maths in everyday life—whether it's managing money, measuring ingredients for cooking, reading a map or making sense of timetables or a mobile phone plan. It also prepares them for future study and careers that rely on mathematical skills.

As students master mathematical skills, they gain fluency in applying concepts to different situations, choosing the best approach to solve problems, and making sense of the world through maths. These skills not only support their learning now but also prepare them for future study and careers that rely on strong mathematical thinking.



NATIONAL SIMULTANEOUS STORYTIME

National Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) is held annually by the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA). Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools, pre-schools, childcare centres, family homes, bookshops and many other places around the country. Now in its 25th successful year, it is a colourful, vibrant, fun event that aims to promote the value of reading and literacy. The book this year was called Truck Cat, written by Debora Frenkel and Danny Snell.



This year students in Foundation to Year 4 participated in NSS, either by watching the story being read live or having their classroom teacher read the book to them. Students discussed the various themes within the book and then completed an activity relating to the book.

Foundation students created paper collage trucks and filled them with items from food catalogues. Some of the Year 1/2 students made origami cats and some of the Year 3/4 students created a collage of images and places that remind them of home.

Pizzelle come from the Abruzzo region of Italy and are said to be one of the oldest cookies!









Recipe: 4 eggs (uova) 8 tablespoons of sugar (Zucchero) 8 tablespoons of sunflower oil (olio) I sachet of vanilla sugar (zucchero vanigliato) or a few drops of vanilla 500g plain flour (farina) essence 1. Beat the eggs and the sugar 3. Add the vanilla sugar and mix 2.Add the oil and mix 4. Add the flour gradually and mix until you get a thick dough 5. Roll out into sixteen balls, use more 6.0il the pizzelle maker so don't stick. place onto centre of pizzelle make and hold down for thirty seconds. Phreelle Makers can be purchased here


ART ROOM NEWS


VICTORIAN CHALLEGES AND ENRICHMENT SERIES - MATHS







Students found the content to be both interesting and challenging and it continues to cultivate a love of mathematics and problem solving.


















CROSS COUNTRY
