






VICTORIAN STUDENTS PARLIAMENTARY PROGRAM

Last week a group of our Grade 5 and 6 students attended the online Victorian Students' Parliamentary Program. It consisted of a series of student conventions, which provided students with opportunities to learn about Australia's constitution and systems of government. Students learned by participating in parliamentary style debates on a range of topics. The main topic of debate was 'Should public transport be free in Victoria?' It was a very enlightening two day course and students gained a lot of knowledge through these conversations and listening to others' view points.





Day 1


On the 29th of July 2025, 26 students from Strathmore Primary School got selected to participate in the Victorian Students Parliamentary Program. Eleven schools participated in this program, and we were chosen from all over Victoria. There were about 140 people. Our topic was 'Should public transport be free in Victoria?'. Sandra Venneri, our facilitator, explained how the parliamentary law-making process operates. One person from every school made their opening statement. We also made our first vote with most people voting 'no' and only a couple people saying 'yes'. The first presentation was by Mr Will Fooks, Director, Eukai.

The presentation was detailed and shared lots of information and knowledge. Then we got a brain break where we played silent ball. After that it was time for keynote presentations, two by Dr Abraham Leung, Advance Queensland Industry Research Fellow, Cities Research Institute - Transport Research Group, Griffith University. The next thing we did was split into two groups and write statements about our opinions and try to convince the others to think what we think. Overall day one was a great day and we all really enjoyed it.

At the final vote, out of 140 students only 24% voted yes and 76% voted no! Overall, it was a fantastic event and we learnt a lot from the experience.
